







In Thrissur district Sri Vyasa NSS college National Service Scheme unit in association with Ottupara hospital effectively involved in the survey of Wadakkanchery area from 5-12-2018 to 18-12-2018 continuously. More than 70 volunteers engaged in the survey.

✓ Water Testing Lab-A Satellite Lab of KWA




Water quality testing lab functioning as a satellite lab under the project initially aided by KWA-The kerala water authority, a government agency for monitoring water quality, supply and related matters. It started functioning from 2007 onwards. Vyasa College through this lab under ENVIRO club –PG & research Dept. of Chemistry has been providing water quality testing service at a nominal rate which covers a non-profitable charge to cover chemical cost and analyst remuneration. All the testing has been done as per IS-10500. The Enviro club plans and undertakes surveys to identify water quality parameters in the nearby places with the help of students and to places under. The analyst is Mrs. Gopika with Post Graduation in chemistry and 5 years of analytic experience.

- ✓ **Research Labs:** Researchers can avail instrumentation facilities at science labs in the college –UV-Vis Spectrophotometer, Spin Coater, Electrochemical Workstation, Muffle Furnace are few among the facilities available.
- ✓ **Herbarium and Fern House**: Botany Department along with the teaching staff are engaged in field visit inside the campus every year. The students are getting hands on training in the identification of plants. the name board with binomial name and common name were placed near each plant by the students.



The Department maintained a well-organized Herbarium. The preserved plant specimen is very much helpful to the students of the Department for the identification of a particular plant. The students also engaged in making herbarium and keeping them in herbarium rack for future purpose.





5. Health and Wellness Initiatives

- ✓ Health camp conducted for teachers and other elders of the Parlikkad area on 10-07-2018. 50 body tests were done with a meagre amount of Rs 600.
- ✓ Conducted special camp from 22-12-2018 to 28-12-2018 in Vazhachal forest reserve area doing activities like environment protection, plastic pollution control, Vazhachal check post permit issue, checking of alchohol and other harmful items, rally etc.



✓ Blood donation camp conducted on **22 November-2020** in association with government hospital, Athani and HDFC bank



✓ Koodeyund Vyasa- Standing for the flood Survivors

Sanitiser Preparation and awareness campaign during Covid-19 Pandemic out break-

: When covid pandemic choked our lives during February 2020, UG and PG chemistry students were in the war front to spread messages of break the chain campaign during the initial outbreak. They prepared sanitizers and supplied them to college, commoners in and around Vyasagiri premises/public servants. The process was initiated on 17.03.2020. Principal Smt. Kavitha inaugurated the campaign by receiving sanitizer from Campaign Leader Ashique. H.O.D Dr RManu and faculty members were present for the same. To combat sanitizer scarcity -under the guidance of faculty ,postgraduate students helped commoners from different social groups to prepare sanitizers.

✓ Mobilizing Sanitizer Production and Awareness Online in the Face of Covid-

Covid 19-Amidst the Covid-19 pandemic, there was a critical shortage of hand sanitizer. The Department of Physics, in collaboration with libraries, NGOs, and youth organizations, initiated a joint effort to produce hand sanitizer and promote awareness about Covid-19 prevention measures. This initiative aimed to utilize combined resources and expertise to address community needs during the crisis.

During Covid scenario college union UUC Ananthu M.R and team were in war front of rescue operations and also assisted in cremetion of demised people whose relative were non willing to collect body. Volunteers from NSS, NCC Worked to manage social wellbeing of the society by extended services as food supply, medicine supply and supply of clothings and groceries when world was locked down.

✓ "Kaithangu" -Social Extension Activity

On June 11, 2021, the B.A History students, under the coordination of Mrs. Noorjahan Majeed, organized the "Kaithangu" social extension activity at the Government Tribal

School in Vazhani, building on the success of the previous "Kanivu" program and showcasing the department's best practice of fostering mentor-mentee relationships through direct engagement. This follow-up initiative aimed at supporting and raising awareness about tribal communities, involved the distribution of educational materials to enhance academic opportunities, a video presentation on the historical significance of various tribal groups, and interactive discussions to deepen cultural understanding. 




✓ Menstrual Cup Awareness Programme by Women Cell on 17-12-2022.

As part of this endeavor, an interactive session was organized, featuring doctors from a Govt. Medical College, Thrissur who provided valuable insights on menstrual health and hygiene.
